

CHANGE ISN'T SOMETHING WE HAVE TO FEAR!

Past one year, the Catholic Church has been actively preparing itself as to how - draw and strengthen the lives of young people. A yearlong preparations, talkings, discussions, sharings at local, regional and national level have happened keeping the Bishops Synod - October 2018 on Youth as a focus point. Pope Francis himself has clearly expressed, "Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment' be the centre of attention, because you are in my heart."

The Church seemed to have realized the need to listen, accompany and empower the youth of today. They have got into the action of discussion, deliberation and debate. This is a welcome gesture. But should we not remind ourselves that this is not the first time that this process had gone by and shall not be the last? Then, why are we where we are today? This state of affairs should awaken us to the reality that 'something needs to be fixed'. What could that some thing be? It is simply: the Change of Attitude of Church towards YOUNG. It gives me hope to see that the buzz phrases like 'cultural shift', 'epochal change' and 'massive challenge' at the Synod of Bishops, Rome are consciously used.

This Synod, I trust is **Church's God given opportunity** to have a hard look at itself and wash away all that is not helpful to be at the service of **'Young'**. The young participants of the Synod represent the Young World's hopes and aspirations. They forthrightly say,

- 1. 'We are tired of reading documents 100 or 200 pages long. We young people want to see some practical things, steps, for young people to use to and want to read or listen to.'
- 2. 'For Church it is an opportunity to understand what we feel, what we have to say.'
- 3. 'We seek guidance and accompaniment, especially with the changing paradigms of the world today.'

4. 'In order to teach justice and mercy to our young people, the church must first be a place of justice and mercy for our young people'.

What they say and ask is too much to attend to? May God help us and the Church to move towards the culture of listening, smelling, walking, singing and dancing with the young and thus lead them to be the ambassadors of peace, compassion and service.

I personally believe that the young people of today are open, interested and ready to receive anything that is given to them plainly with authenticity, credibility and sincerity. Let us strive to 'walk the talk' as our Master did.





Inde Espoir 2018 @ Katukapally, India

Born in 1982 from a collaboration between Indian and French Jesuits, the "India-Hope" association sends several dozens of French students each year to villages and slums in southern India to help build schools, community centers, clinics and homes for the poorest people.

This year, a dynamic team of 9 girls and 6 boys, between 18 and 22 years old, and 2 Jesuits had their live in experience (Staying, Working, Eating and Playing) with the disadvantaged tribes at Katukapally near Bhadrachalam, Andhra Pradesh, India.

They come from varied backgrounds of study like: law, biology, political science, industrial design, nursing, engineering, accountancy, Civil Service etc. They helped build five classrooms for the tribal youth to undergo Skill Training Courses and thus improve their quality of life.








Plan - Proposed Community Centre @ Andhra Loyola Campus, Vijayawada
